OLD MASTERS IN HARRISBURG

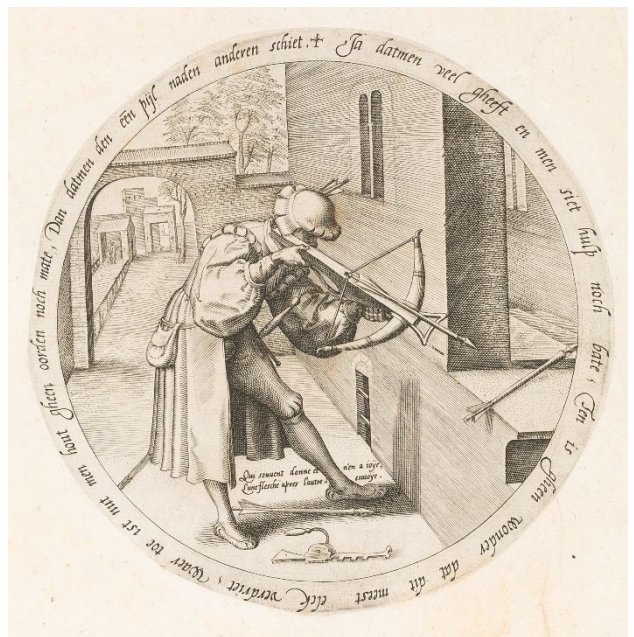
Harrisburg, PA – Susquehanna Art Museum’s newest Lehr Gallery exhibition *Four Seasons and Seven Vices: Old Master Prints in Series* brings the Renaissance to life in Harrisburg! Historic works of printmaking were often created as part of a thematic series. Artists depicted well-known stories of the seasons, elements, planets, virtues, and vices. A selection of these 15th and 16th century works of art are on view through January 23, 2022.

This style was particularly popular during the Renaissance and Baroque eras when a variety of forces—esthetic, commercial, educational, and religious in nature—led to the illustration of themes. *Four Seasons and Seven Vices* introduces this approach to printmaking and collecting, highlighting why it found such favor at this time. It features work by leading artists including Jacques Callot, William Hogarth, Jacob Matham, and Jan Pieterszoon Saenredam.

Phillip Earenfight, Director of the Trout Gallery, will be leading a gallery tour and discussion of this work in the Lehr Gallery on Sunday December 12 at 2:00pm. This special event is free with standard museum admission.
